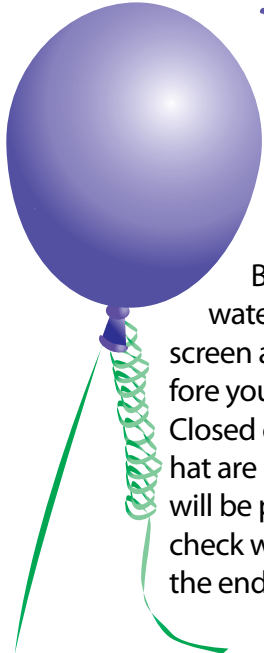

## Registration Fees

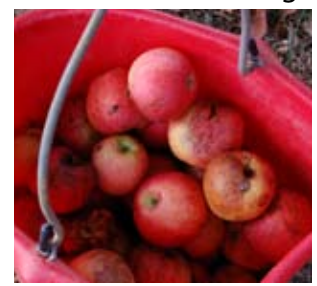
A one-time registration fee of \$40 and camp tuition fee in full are required at time of registration. Families enrolling in multiple sessions may pay camp tuition fees in two installments: 50% with registration and 50% by May 21. Full payment must be made by May 21 to reserve a space without incurring a late registration fee of \$30.

NCTRC reserves the right to cancel or combine camps if there are not enough campers in one camp. NCTRC will refund 70% of camp tuition fee if cancellation made in writing three weeks prior to camp session. No refunds halfway through any camp session.

## Cock-a-doodle-do: Be a Farmer for the Week

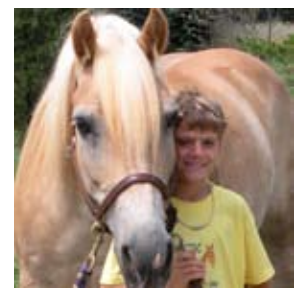
**June 28 – July 2** Try your hand at being a farmer! Mornings filled with horseback riding lessons and afternoons spent tending to farm life. Build a sieve for a pig, pick apples from a tree, shear sheep, collect eggs from chickens, care for the horses. Spend some time fishing in the pond, playing basketball or card games – you choose! On the last day of camp eat an apple pie baked with all those apples we collected – yum!



## Expedition by Horse

**June 14 – June 18 & July 12-16**

Saddle up the horses– it's time to mount your own expedition! Mornings filled with horseback riding classes and afternoons spent participating in outdoor activities and preparing for an adventurous final camp day expedition by horse. Ride on 28 acres of farmland, into the pasture, down to the creek and around to the field where the cows graze and a farmer grows hay and then a stop at the pond for a lunch break. And there's no turning back.



## Horseback Riding: Enduring Cowboys & Girls

**June 21 – 25, July 5 – 9 & July 19 – 23**

The days will begin saddling up your horses for a ride. You'll do chores fit only for cowboys and cowgirls; put on the reins and halters, bathe and feed the horses, check out the sky for the crows and buzzards, and paint a horse. There will be a show on the final day of camp --- dress up cowboy style. Though tough at times, the cowboy and cowgirl life has it rewards. Learn the value of an honest day's work under the open sky, and the sense of accomplishment the work brings. But it won't be all work --- join us for a picnic, maybe some fishing, cowboy games, play basketball or draw.
